Plants and Plant Products

The Government are yet to produce an exhaustive list of products which will require Phytosanitary certificates from either the 1st January or from the 1st April. We will update this presentation once it has been published.

Those products not subject to controls from the 1st January 2021 which are regulated plants and plant products will need to be accompanied by a phytosanitary certificate from 1st April 2021.

A documentary check will always be undertaken. We are waiting for further guidance to be published for consignments that require a physical examination.

Animal Products, Fish, Shellfish and Their Products

Products not subject to controls from the 1st January 2021 will need to be accompanied by an Export Health Certificate issued by a competent authority in the EU in order to undergo documentary checks.

Authorities will need to be notified of each consignment on the new Import of Products, Animals, Food and Feed System (IPAFFS) in advance of the goods arrival at the port of departure.
