The goods must always be accompanied by the original certificate.

In addition to the Export Certificate the supplier will need to send, with the goods, an Import Certificate for the goods to be imported from the EU. Further information can be found [here](#).

High Risk Plants, Plant Products, Products of Animal Origin, Live Animals, Fish, Shellfish and Their Products – 1st January 2021.

The Government are yet to produce an exhaustive list of the products which will require Phytosanitary certificates from the 1st January 2021. We will update this presentation once it has been published. It will include: -

All plants for planting - ware potatoes - some seeds - some timber - used agricultural / forestry machinery.

All importers will need to be [register for IPAFFS online](#) and our understanding those who have registered for the DEFRA PEACH system will automatically be registered in IPAFFS as the products will require pre notification on this system. As part of the process you will need to nominate ChannelPorts as your Customs intermediary / agent.

Excise goods – 1st January 2021

The Government has produced a full guide to [importing excise goods](#) which will give you a good understanding.

Importing excise goods into a duty suspension warehouse to avoid paying the taxes on arrival in the UK, you will need to be registered on the UK's [Excise Movement and Control System](#) (EMCS) as this will control the movement from the place of entry into the UK to their final destination.
